# Math Station Contract: +/- Concepts

Activity	Date	Points	What I Learned
<b>1. Unifix Cubes</b> Students build & record examples of +/- number sentences using unifix cubes of two colors snapped into trains.			
<b>2. Jewels</b> Students build & record examples of +/- number sentences using jewels inside of portions cups.			
<b>3. Bowls + Bears</b> Students build & record examples of +/- number sentences using teddy bears placed on top of and underneath bowls.			
<b>4. What's Missing</b> Students roll dice to fill in the top and bottom numbers of a vertical problem. Their task is to determine what the operation is and what the missing addend or subtrahend is.			
<b>5. Beans in Your Hands</b> Students build examples of +/- number sentences using beans placed on mats with representations of two hands drawn on them.			
<b>6. Dominoes</b> Students record examples of +/- number sentences by counting the dots on the two sides of dominoes or create magic squares using two dominoes.			
<b>7. Red &amp; White Beans</b> Students build examples of +/- number sentences by counting a number of the two sided red and white beans, shaking them and counting and recording how many were red and how many white.			
<b>8. Piggybank Subtraction</b> Students get a game card, count out the total number of pennies and put some in the bank to see how many are left.			
<b>9. Writing Numbers</b> Students spin a spinner and practice writing numbers in a column. They stop whenever one column becomes filled.			
<b>10. Tens Frames</b> Students use tens frames to model +/- number sentences.
