

Map, Driving Directions to Willamette & What to bring to OML?

When you first arrive: Follow directions in the email you received from Jill Sumerlin (omljills@gmail.com) for attendees staying on campus, or from Becky Reed (octmbnreed@g.com) for attendees who are not staying on campus. You may also want to see the map on the next page.

Dorm information: On the map, the dorm is highlighted in yellow near the number 28. There is a sky bridge across 12th Street to campus. The accommodations are dorm rooms with mostly individual bedrooms; some have a kitchen unit. There is one bathroom in the triads and two in the quads. You will be provided bedding: one blanket one pillow, one pillow case, two flat sheets, 1 bath towel, 1 hand towel and 1 washcloth. If you want more, please bring extras. There is a swimming pool, but last year it was closed for repairs. You will be allowed to park in the lot by the dorm to load and unload and then park down the street in the permitted space.

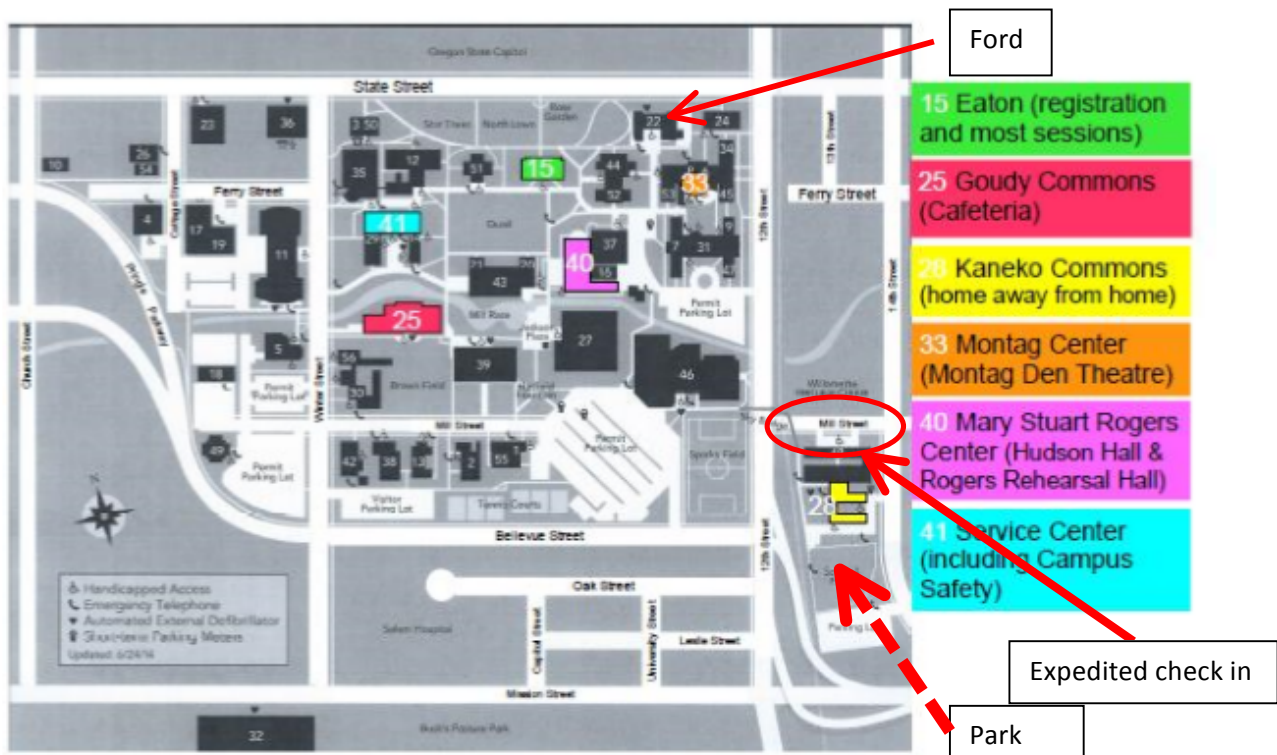
Checkout Sunday:

During the final Area Meeting(s) at 8:10-9:10, groups will go to registration for check out materials. Letter of participation(if you provided supervisor information), PDU certificate & receipt will be given out by area.

Room and meal cards are disposable and do not need to be returned.

What to bring?/Suggested items:

- Laptop or electronic device
- Extra towel/blanket/pillow
- Soap for shower and other toiletries (shampoo, paper towels, hand soap, etc.)
- Drinking cup for room & water bottle for campus
- Swim suit & extra towel (pool may be open)
- Alarm clock
- Reading light/lamp
- Paper, pencil...you are in class!
- This year you should not need a fan...dorm rooms are air conditioned.
- Internet access will be available and instructions will be in the program booklet that you will get at registration.

- As adults, alcohol is allowed in the dorm rooms, but not in the open spaces. Please respect the Willamette expectations.



From I-5 (North or South)

1. Take the Highway 22 exit (number 253).
2. At the first light, head west (a left turn for those coming from the south, a right when coming from the north).
3. Stay on Highway 22 for about 1.5 miles.
4. As you pass 17th street you'll start up an overpass.
5. At the top of this overpass there is an exit to the right.
6. Take this exit (Willamette University is indicated on the sign).
7. Keep left as the exit divides.
8. After passing through the stoplight, you will see a Willamette University sign and entrance to the right. Pass by, and continue to the next stoplight: Winter Street.
9. Turn R on Winter St. & pull into the Guest Parking lot immediately on the right. Park on Winter, too.

FROM WEST: follow signage for Hwy 22 and turn left on Winter from Pringle Parkway/Bellevue.

PARKING

- Willamette parking permits are required on all vehicles (except motorcycles) **weekdays**, 9 a.m.–3 p.m., year-round.
- Guest Parking Lot: northeast corner of Winter and Bellevue streets. Visitors may purchase a one-day permit if space is available. Cost: \$5, or \$3 after noon.
- Metered and unmetered city parking is available nearby on Winter, State and Cottage streets.
- Guests invited to campus by university departments may park for free in the Guest Parking Lot if reservations are made in advance by the host.
- Motorcycles may park only in the designated motorcycle lots, east side of Winter Street between Lausanne Hall and Goudy Commons, or west side of Matthews lot, off 12th Street, near the footbridge.
